O Christ God, who appeared and illumined the world, glory to You.

PRAYER MINISTRY

Epistle Reading The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 4:7-13

Let your mercy, O Lord, be upon us. Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous.

BRETHREN, grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men." (in saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

Communion Prayers

I believe and confess, Lord, that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, Who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first. I also believe that this is truly Your pure Body and that this is truly Your precious Blood. Therefore, I pray to You, have mercy upon me, and forgive my transgressions, voluntary and involuntary, in word and deed, in knowledge or in ignorance. And make me worthy, without condemnation, to partake of Your pure Mysteries for the remission of sins and for eternal life. Amen.

Behold, I approach for Divine Communion. O Maker, burn me not as I partake, For You are fire consuming the unworthy. But cleanse me from every stain.

Parish Council Affirmation of Office: Today after the Divine Liturgy, we will have the Swearing-In Ceremony for the new Parish Council.

Mortgage Reduction Campaign: We did it! Our Mortgage Reduction Campaign raised \$133,712.11 in 2024, which secured us an anonymous matching gift of \$100,000. Along with our regular payments, our mortgage, which started in April 2012 at \$1,550,000, was reduced from \$654,115.57 on January 1, 2024 to \$329,426.20 on January 1, 2025. Thank you to our Stewards and friends who participated in 2024, and please help us continue to reduce the mortgage to \$0 in the near future.
