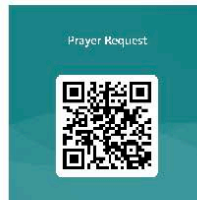
"And whatever things you ask in prayer, believing you will receive." Matthew 21:22

Epistle Reading

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3:4-11

*You, O Lord, shall keep us and preserve us.
Verse: Save me, O Lord, for the godly man has failed.*

Brethren, when Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience. In these you once walked, when you lived in them. But now put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all.

Blessing of the Homes at Theophany

If you wish to have your homes and/or businesses blessed after the Feast of Theophany, please contact the Parish office to schedule a visitation (office@saintsophiachurch.org or 610-650-8960.)

Persons who have never had a house blessing often wonder what to do when the priest comes and what happens while he is there. The procedure is as follows:

- 1. Welcome the priest into your home.
- 2. Turn off the television and stereos and gather your family before the family icons or in the dining room.
- 3. Present to the priest a list of family members and loved ones you wish the priest to pray.
- 4. Be attentive to the prayers and recite the Lord's Prayer with the priest.
- 5. When it comes time to bless the home, one family member should lead the priest to the various rooms to be blessed. Other family members should remain in the "prayer area" until the priest returns.
- 6. The priest offers a concluding prayer

Communion Prayers

Mortgage Reduction Campaign: *We did it!* Our Mortgage Reduction Campaign raised \$133,712.11 in 2024, which secured us an anonymous matching gift of \$100,000. Along with our regular payments, our mortgage, which started in April 2012 at \$1,550,000, was reduced from \$654,115.57 on January 1, 2024 to **\$329,426.20 on January 1, 2025**. Thank you to our Stewards and friends who participated in 2024, and please help us continue to reduce the mortgage to \$0 in the near future.
